Four Named Directors by Employers Council

DENVER—Four Colorado business executives have been named to three-year terms on the Mountain States Employers Council’s Board of Directors, it was announced today by MSEC President Michael G. Severns.

Named to join the 30-member Board were: Stephen Bartolin Jr., president and CEO of the Broadmoor, Colorado Springs; Larry Edward Penley, president and chancellor of Colorado State University, Fort Collins; Robert K. (Rocky) Scott, president of the Greater Colorado Springs Economic Development Corporation, and Patricia Kay Vincent, president, customer and field operations, Xcel Energy, Denver.

“We are pleased and honored to have these executives on our Board, continuing our tradition of Board members who are the chief executive officers of their respective business organizations,” Severns said. “We are equally pleased that their geographic diversity reflects the wide reach of Mountain States Employers Council. We look forward to working with each new member as we continue to serve the employer community of Colorado and the Rocky Mountain West.”

Bartolin, who came to the Broadmoor in 1991, has overseen more than \$100 million reinvested in the world famous resort, including the addition of 150 rooms, a new golf club, the \$35-million restoration of Broadmoor’s main building and the total refurbishment of the hotel and grounds. Penley, appointed CSU president and chancellor in 2003, came to the university from Arizona State University, where he was dean of the W. P. Carey School of Business.

Scott has served as Greater Colorado Springs Economic Development Corporation’s president since 1989. Under his leadership, the EDC has twice been named one of the top 10 economic development organizations in the nation by a major industry trade publication. Scott was named the 2000 Business Citizen of the Year by the Colorado Springs Chamber of Commerce. Vincent joined New Century Energy, parent company of Xcel, in 1999 as vice president of marketing. Prior, she was vice president of marketing and sales for Arizona Public Service Co. She is a Board member of Downtown Denver Inc., and Junior Achievement -- Rocky Mountain Inc.
